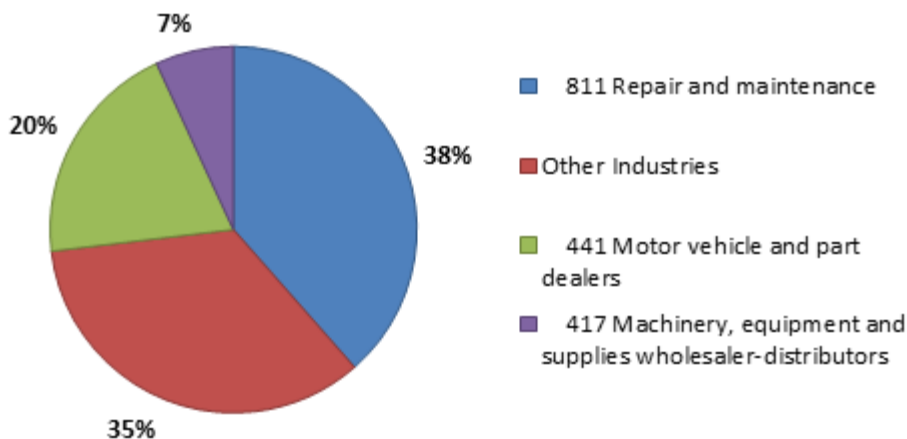


Sector Description

This could include motorcycles, cars, trucks (both heavy and light) as well as agricultural equipment such as tractors. Motive Power Sector Main Industries



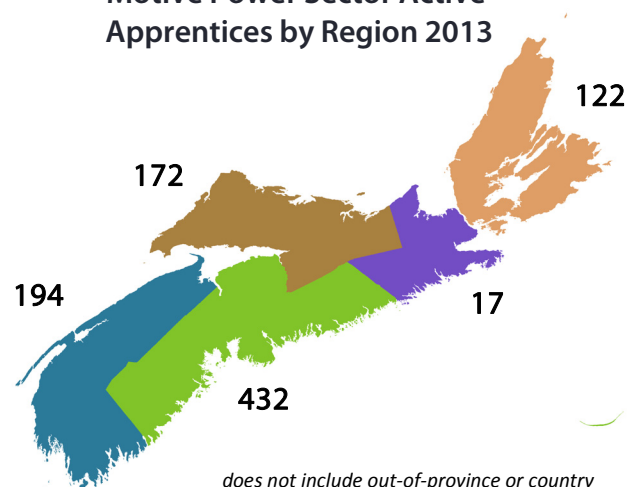

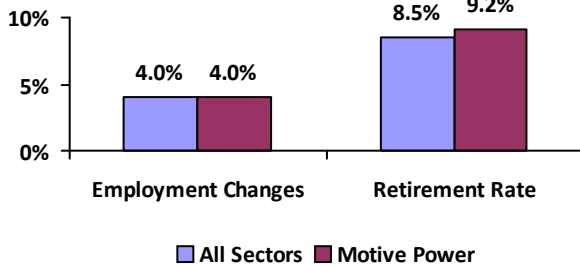
Motive Power Sector Active Apprentices by Region 2013

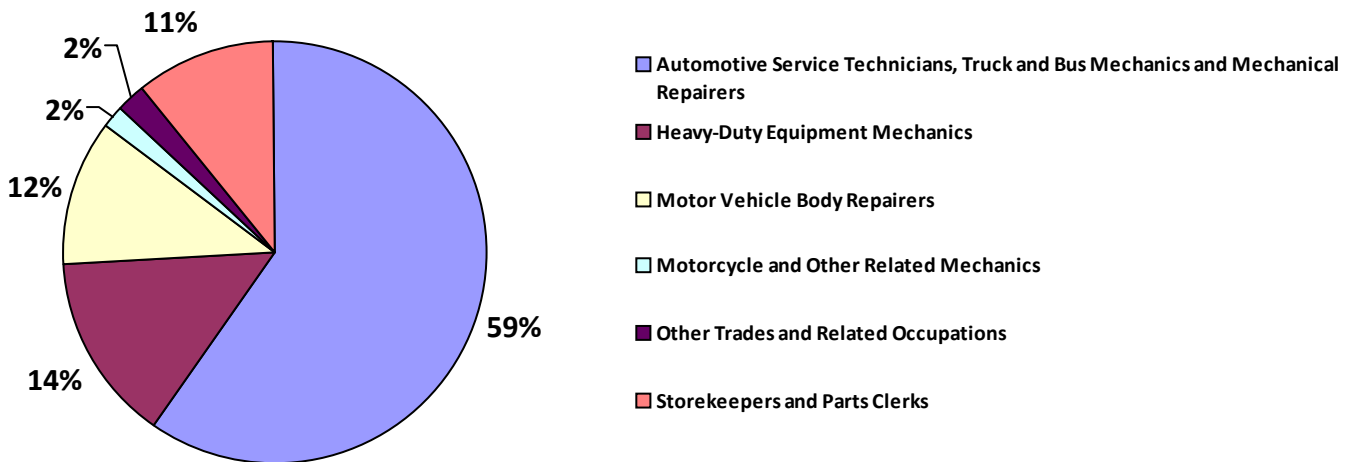

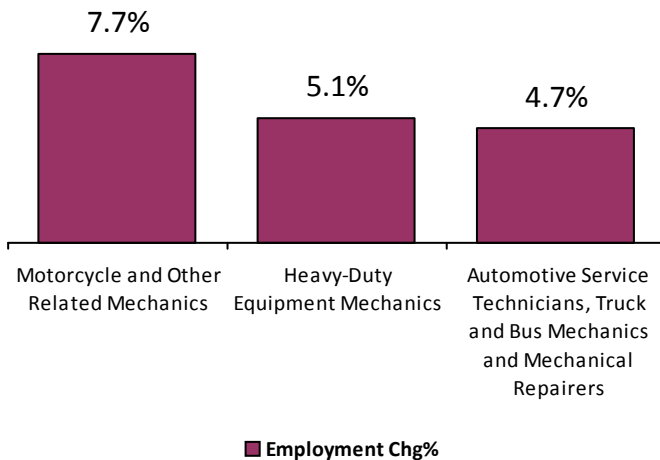
