

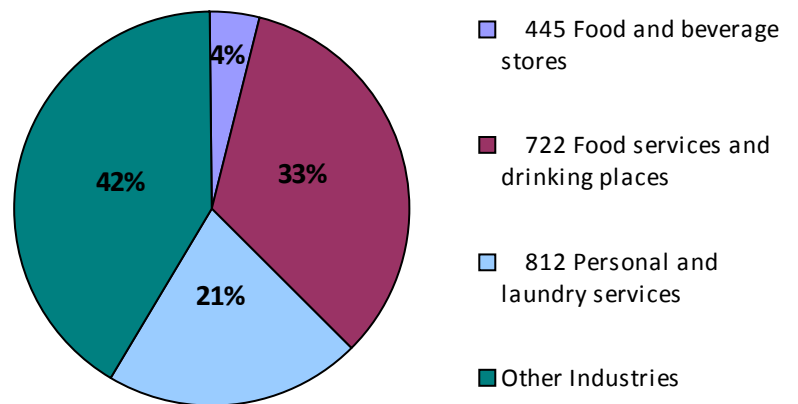
## Sector Description:

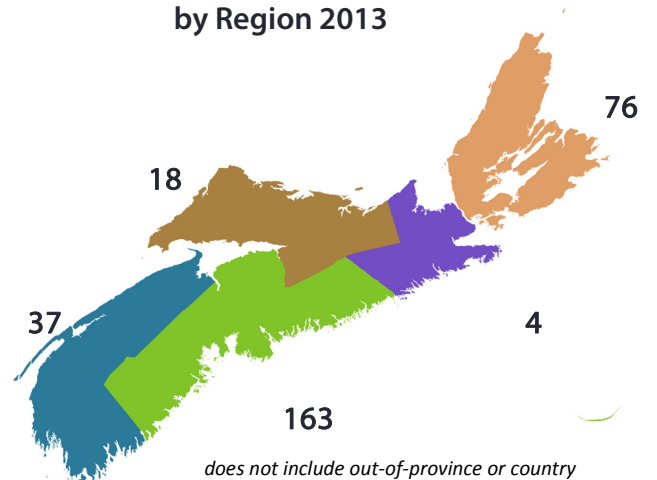
### Service Sector - Main Industries

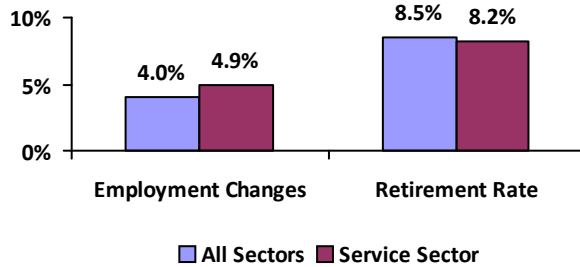
### Service Sector Active Apprentices by Region 2013

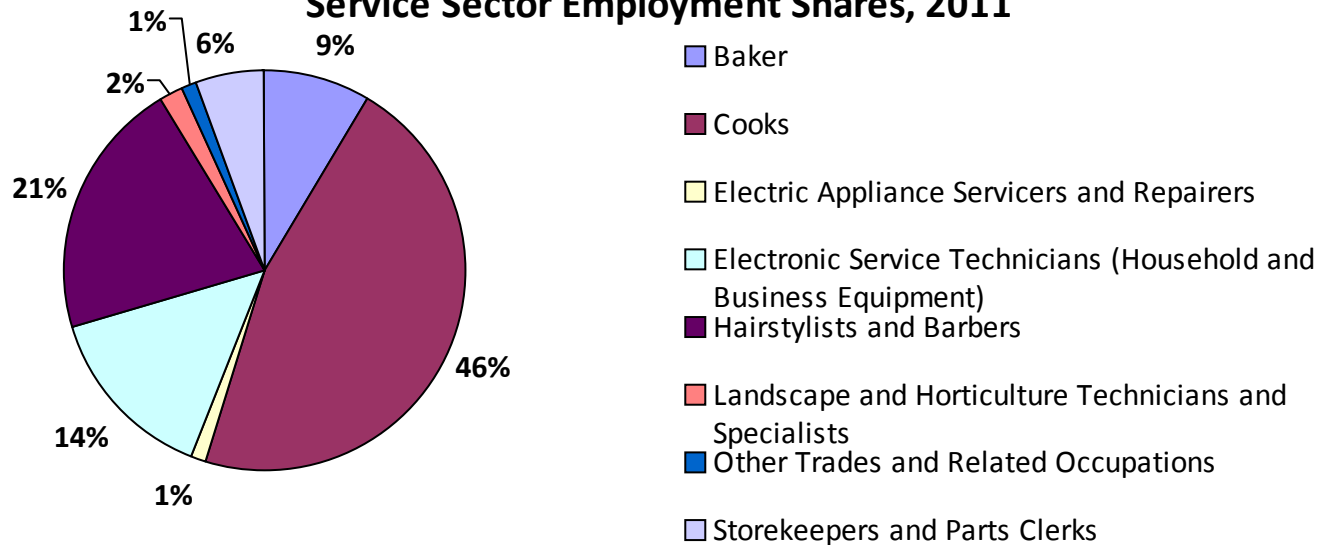

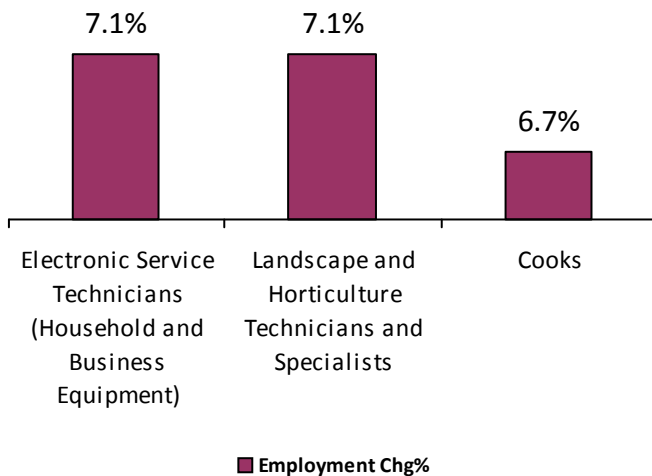
